Application Procedure

Online application

Chalmers has implemented an online application system, "moveonnet", for the academic year 2011/2012. Nominated students should submit the following documents (if a student already has sent an application by regular mail, we request that the student add their personal data in our online system without sending a paper copy to Chalmers):

 - http://chalmers.moveonnet.eu/moveonline/incoming printed and signed by applicant and in addition bearing stamp and signature of the International Office of the home university.
- 2. One page **letter of motivation** stating the reasons for applying to Chalmers (in English)
- 3. An official transcript of records
- 4. Passport-size photo

e-nomination

The partner university selects students for the exchange program and nominates them for the exchange semester stay via the online platform "moveonnet" (http://www.moveonnet.eu). After an acknowledgement mail from Chalmers, the coordinator of the home university sends the application documents to Chalmers according to the instructions above.

Learning Agreement

If your home university requires you to hand in a Learning Agreement signed by Chalmers before the beginning of your exchange, please include the Learning Agreement directly with the application. If you need to hand in a Learning Agreement to your home university after having started the exchange at Chalmers, please bring it with you and have it signed from your coordinator at Chalmers after your arrival.

Exchange Coordinator at Chalmers When you have sent your application to Chalmers you will get in contact with a specific exchange coordinator depending on your field of study at Chalmers. This coordinator is not always the same as the contact person for the agreement between Chalmers and your home university.



Academic Information

Semester Dates and Credit System

Autumn Semester 2011: August 29 - December 17 Spring Semester 2012: January 16 - May 29

Each semester at Chalmers is divided into two study periods which ends with one examination week. 1 credit at Chalmers corresponds to 1 ECTS (Chalmers do not use ECTS grades). Full time studies correspond to 30 credits per semester. As a student you are recommended to take 2 courses of 7.5 credits each during one study period. Please note that some courses use other examination types than exams and run over more than one study period.

Schedule

Please, check the schedule for your courses so that there are no clashes between the different courses. Changes of courses can be made when you arrive here at Chalmers if clashes occur.

Language Proficiency

Swedish proficiency is recommended but not required to study at Chalmers since all courses from the masters programs are taught in English. A good knowledge and skills in English, however, is required to successfully pursue your studies at this level at Chalmers.

Grading Systems

At Chalmers two different grading systems are used. Information on which systems that is used is given at the start of each course.

- 1. Grade scale: U, 3, 4, 5
 - 5 =five, 4 =four, 3 =three, U =fail (5is the highest grade)
- 2. Grade scale: U, G

Pass course only, G = pass, U = fail

Academic Transcript

Exchange students are responsible for filling out some papers at Chalmers to get their academic transcript sent to their home universities.

Master's Thesis / Project

If you have intention to do a project or Master's thesis at Chalmers, it is important that you establish a contact with a supervisor at Chalmers before your arrival to Chalmers. In order to contact the right department, you need to know in what subject the project is supposed to be. Also, in contact with a suitable supervisor, you need to have a description of the project and the number of credits it should contain. Please note that not all departments offer projects for exchange students.

Visa Requirements and Residence Permits

Entry Regulations

Citizens of the European Union do not need a visa for Sweden. Citizens from other countries need to check with the Swedish Migration Board whether they need a visa. Health Insurance

Exchange Student Insurance

All incoming exchange students are fully insured during school hours and during travel to and from the location where the school hours are spent. Furthermore, it covers medical expenses and a certain amount of accident cover twenty-four hours a day in Sweden.

Citizens of a **Nordic country**, **EU/EEA country**, **Switzerland**, or other country with which a convention regarding medical benefits exists, must have an **EU card or similar** from their home country for the cover to apply.
